"VIENNA IN DEPTH"

11 days, Saturday, June 9, to Tuesday, June 19, 2018

A leisurely exploration of the superb architecture, fascinating history and culture, and the glorious music and food of one of the world's truly great cities! Our tour includes all the major sights, such as St. Stephen's Cathedral, the State Opera, and the Habsburg Dynasty's Schönbrunn and Belvedere Palaces, as well as fabulous museums and monuments associated with painters such as Bruegel and Klimt and musicians such as Mozart and Schubert. The tour host will be historian Jacques R. Pauwels, PhD, who will lecture on the history and culture of Vienna and Austria in general.

PROPOSED ITINERARY:

<u>Day 1 - Saturday, June 9:</u> Early evening departure from Toronto on Austrian Airlines' non-stop flight to Vienna. Dinner and breakfast will be served on board.

<u>Day 2 - Sunday, June 10:</u> Morning arrival in Vienna, and transfer to the city centre by private coach. En route, we briefly visit the famous Prater Amusement Park with its gigantic Ferris Wheel as well as the Hundertwasser Haus, a spectacular creation by the controversial Austrian artist/architect, Friedensreich Hundertwasser (http://www.museumsinvienna.org/kunsthaus_en.htm). Then we check into the centrally located first-class/four-star Hotel Johann Strauss (http://www.kremslehnerhotels.at/en/hotel-johann-strauss-

vienna; excellent customers reviews on www.tripadvisor.ca/Hotel_Review-g190454-d228062-Reviews-Hotel_Johann_Strauss-Vienna.html). Free time to settle in and get some rest after your overnight flight. In late afternoon, short introductory walk to view some important monuments in the immediate vicinity of our hotel, such as the impressive baroque Charles Church, the Musikverein building, and the Secession Exhibition Hall. Dinner in our hotel or in a nearby restaurant.

Day 3 - Monday, June 11: After breakfast, walking tour of the historical city centre, with sights such as the State Opera; the monument to Mozart; Heroes' Square (Heldenplatz) with the Neue Burg, from whose balcony Hitler proclaimed the "Anschluss" of Austria in March 1938, a dramatic moment in Austrian history, to be commented on by your historian/tour guide; the Hofburg residence of the Habsburg Emperors; Michael's Square (Michaeler Platz), with foundations of Roman Vienna, known as *Vindobona*, as well as outstanding ancient and modern architecture; the upscale pedestrian shopping district of Kaertner Strasse and Graben, and the magnificent Gothic St. Stephen's Cathedral. Mid-morning coffee break in the historical Café Demel with its 19th-century décor, conjuring up the pre-WW I era when the Habsburgs still ruled this part of Europe! Afternoon free to explore Vienna on your own. This evening, dinner in a typical restaurant



<u>Day 4 – Tuesday, June 12:</u> This morning we first explore the Naschmarkt, Vienna's fabulous food market, then enjoy a streetcar ride to admire the grandiose monuments along the Ring Boulevard, such as the Austrian Parliament, the City Hall, the university, and the City Park. Resuming our walking tour of the historical city centre, we pause at the Monument Against War and Fascism on our way to the Capuchin Crypt, the mausoleum of the Habsburg Dynasty, with the elaborate tombs of e.g. Empress Maria-Theresa, Emperor Francis-Joseph, Crown Prince Rudolph, and Maria-Louise, Napoleon's second wife and the mother of his only son, the Duke of Reichstadt; the latter used to be here, but was moved to Paris to rest with his father in the Invalides – your guide will explain! The gourmets among us may want to conclude this busy program with a piece of Sachertorte, a world-famous Viennese variation on the death-by-chocolate theme, in the café of the hotel Sacher, located just behind the State Opera; it is also an excellent, though not inexpensive, choice for lunch! Rest of the day at leisure.

GETTING AROUND:

We will explore much of Vienna on foot, so participants must be willing and able to do a lot of walking! However, our hotel is very centrally located, and most sights and monuments are concentrated in the relatively small area within the circular Ringstrasse. Moreover, we will take advantage of the excellent and very "user-friendly" public transportation system, with streetcars (boarded at street level) and subways; the Taubstummengasse Subway Station is located next-door to our hotel, see https://www.metrolinemap.com/station/vienna/taubstummengasse. For transfers and visits to outlying areas, a comfortable private coach will be used.

<u>Day 5 - Wednesday, June 13:</u> A very special day, devoted to the music of Vienna, with as hostess Canadian musicologist (and Vienna-resident) Dr. Rita Steblin, one of the world's top expert on Schubert, Bach, and other composers – she even revealed the true identity of Beethoven's "immortal beloved"! We first visit Vienna's Central Cemetery, with the tombs of famous composers such as Beethoven, Brahms, Schubert, and Strauss. Returning to central Vienna, we visit the Figaro Haus, where Mozart composed his famous opera, and Schubert's birthplace/museum. (Rita would also love to take us to the Museum of Musical Instruments, but it will probably still be closed for renovations.) This evening, dinner in a restaurant featuring Balkan specialties, accompanied by traditional music!

Day 6 - Thursday, June 14: Morning visit to the Museum of Art History (*Kunsthistorisches Museum*), considered to be one of the world's finest museums on account of its magnificent architecture and interior decoration plus an amazing art collection that includes treasures from Ancient Egypt and Greek Antiquity to the late 18th century; among the highlights are paintings by the likes of Dürer, Raphael, Bruegel, Rembrandt, Rubens, Titian, Velázquez, and Vermeer (http://www.museumsinvienna.org/khm_en.htm). In the afternoon, visit to the Imperial Treasury, located in the Hofburg Palace, where we will admire more Habsburg treasures and insignia, e.g. the imperial crown, insignia and jewels as well as pieces of jewellery once worn by Empress Elisabeth, better known as "Sissi."

<u>Day 7 - Friday, June 15:</u> Day entirely at leisure for shopping, enjoying the city on your own, and/or visiting museums such as the Natural History Museum; the Leopold museum, one the largest museums of modern Austrian art, with works by artists such as Kokoschka, Schiele, and Klimt; the interactive House of Music museum; the Modern Art Collection (MUMOK), one of Europe's most impressive collections of modern art, featuring works by Picasso, Warhol, etc.; the Ephesos Museum, with fascinating objects from this antique metropolis on the Aegean coast of present-day Turkey; and the Museum of Military History, where one can view the automobile in which Archduke Franz Ferdinand, the heir to the throne, and his wife were assassinated in Sarajevo in 1914, an event that marked the beginning of the Great War.

<u>Day 8 - Saturday, June 16:</u> This morning we walk via the little-known monument dedicated to Kolschitzky, a hero of the famous Turkish siege of 1683, who introduced coffee to the Viennese, to the magnificent Belvedere Palace, with its fabulous collection of masterpieces by modern Austrian painters such as Klimt and Kokoschka (https://www.belvedere.at/en). On the way back to the hotel, we view the Red Army Memorial, where your guide will explain another chapter of Viennese history, the birth of a free, independent, but neutral Austrian state in the wake of WW II. If there is sufficient interest, an *optional* daytrip (by train) may be arranged to Mozart's beautiful birthplace, Salzburg.

MUSIC!

A <u>classical music concert</u> will be included in our tour program, with date, time and venue TBA. It should also be possible to attend an opera or ballet performance in the world-famous State Opera on an optional basis, but prices are generally very high. Operettas, performed frequently in the People's Opera (*Volksoper*), tend to be quite a bit less expensive. Let us know ASAP if you are interested in any of these performances!

<u>Day 9 - Sunday, June 17:</u> This morning, two *optional* activities may be of interest to tour members: (1) at 9:15, a Schubert-Mass with the Vienna Boys' Choir in the chapel of the Hofburg Palace, with prices starting around \$20; (2) at 11, a performance of the Lipizaner Horses in the world-famous Spanish Riding School, with prices starting around \$45 for standing room and around \$75 for seats; please advise ASAP if you are interested!

<u>Day 10 – Monday, June 18:</u> This morning we first visit the magnificent palace and gardens of Schoenbrunn, the former summer residence of Habsburgs rulers such as Maria-Theresa and Francis-Joseph. Then we enjoy an excursion (by private coach) into the Vienna Woods, with visit to the pretty town of Baden, Heiligenkreuz Abbey, and the hunting lodge at Mayerling, site of the tragic death of Crown Prince Rudolph and his young mistress. Returning to Vienna, we ascend the Kahlenberg Hill for a fabulous view of the city; this is also the site where in 1683 the Turks, who had been besieging Vienna for months, were defeated by Polish King John Sobieski; a small church commemorates this proud moment in Polish as well as Austrian history. In the quaint nearby village of Heiligenstadt, where Beethoven used to live, we enjoy a traditional dinner of local specialties in a "heurigen," a wine tavern suitably named the "Beethovenhaus."

<u>Day 11 – Tuesday, June 19</u>: After breakfast, transfer to the airport and non-stop return flight with Austrian Airlines to Toronto; departure at 10:40 AM, and arrival at 2:10 PM.

RESERVATIONS AND DEPOSITS:

Reservations should be made as early as possible to ensure the departure of your choice. A deposit of \$750.00 required at the time of registration. Your reservation is confirmed upon receipt of your deposit and registration form. No reservations will be accepted without a signed application form.

REFUND OF UNUSED ARRANGEMENTS:

Because the rates of Pauwels Travel Bureau Ltd. are based on group participation, no refund can be made for any tour accommodation or tour service or tour feature not taken. If cancellation occurs while the tour is in progress, no refund can be made for the tour portion not taken. We strongly suggest that to allow for any unexpected contingencies, you purchase the all-inclusive insurance.

CANCELLATION POLICY:

Refund of deposit is made if cancellation is received in writing by Pauwels Travel Bureau Ltd. more than 90 days prior of the departure date of the tour less a \$500.00 non-refundable administrative fee per person. - 2. I further understand that travel involves certain risks to personal health, safety and property. Many foreign countries do not have the safety and health standards that are present in Canada. I am willing to accept the associated risks and understand that and Pauwels Travel Bureau cannot guarantee the health and safety of travellers in a foreign trip or eliminate the risk from a foreign environment.
- 3. I know that tour programs include walking, and may including hiking and fitness programs that have potential hazardous activities associated with them. I should not participate prior to approval by my physician. I assume any and all other risks associated with these events included but not limited to falls, contact with other participants, the effects of the weather including high heat and/or humidity.
- 4. To release, indemnify and hold harmless Pauwels Travel Bureau and their affiliates (which term shall include parents, subsidiaries, officers, directors, shareholders, agents and employees of Pauwels Travel Bureau as well as Pauwels Travel themselves) (the "Released Parties") from, and agree not to sue the Released Parties for, any claims that I may have arising from, or in connection with, any personal injury, bodily injury, mental anguish, emotional distress, physical, property or other damage that I may suffer from any cause whatsoever related in any way to my participation in this tour.
