A 15-day exploration, from Tuesday, May 9, to Tuesday, May 23, 2023

A leisurely tour focusing on highlights of the four countries surrounding Lake Constance (Bodensee), namely Switzerland's heartland around Lake Lucerne; France's picturesque province of Alsace; the legendary Black Forest in Germany; and Austria's westernmost region around the city of Bregenz...plus the miniature state of Liechtenstein! This tour features very comfortable, traditional family-owned hotels and delicious food, and will be escorted by historian Jacques Pauwels, PhD.

ITINERARY:

Day 1 - Tuesday, May 9: Evening departure from Toronto to Zurich Air Canada's non-stop flight.

<u>Day 2 - Wednesday, May 10</u>: Late morning arrival in Zurich, where a comfortable coach will be waiting to take us to <u>Weggis</u>, an idyllic little resort nestled on the shores of wonderful <u>Lake Lucerne</u>, situated in the middle of the country and surrounded by impressive Alpine peaks, including famous Mount Rigi; the area is often called the 'Riviera' of central Switzerland. Check into the fine three-star <u>Hotel Gotthard</u> and free time to settle in. Dinner in the restaurant of our hotel.

<u>Day 3 – Thursday, May 11</u>: This morning a lake steamer will take us to nearby <u>Lucerne</u>, one of the prettiest cities in Switzerland and all of Europe. Our walking tour here will include the quaint old town, the famous covered wooden Chapel Bridge, emblem of the city, and the impressive Lion's Monument, dedicated to the Swiss soldiers who died defending King Louis XVI during the French Revolution. Also free time to enjoy lunch, shop for

watches and traditional Swiss army knives, and perhaps visit the superb <u>transportation museum</u>. Late afternoon return to Weggis by lake steamer and dinner again in the hotel.

<u>Day 4 – Friday, May 12</u>: Day at leisure in Weggis. Your options include a walk along the shores of the lake, a relaxing tour of the lake by steamer, and a spectacular cable car ride to the top of legendary <u>Mount Rigi</u>, known as "the queen of the mountains," a giant that rises spectacularly to an altitude of nearly 1,800 meters! Dinner again in the hotel.

<u>Day 5 - Saturday, May 13</u>: After breakfast, departure from Weggis by private coach. We cross into France and motor to the picturesque city of <u>Colmar</u>, situated in the heart of <u>Alsace</u>, the French province bordering on Germany as well as Switzerland. Dinner and overnight in the centrally located, comfortable three star/superior tourist-class Hotel Ibis Styles, our home for the next 5 nights. Dinner in a typical restaurant.

<u>Day 6 - Sunday, May 14</u>: Morning sightseeing, on foot and by little tourist train, of Colmar's beautiful medieval city centre, crisscrossed by winding and narrow streets and featuring wood-framed houses, impressive old churches, imposing public buildings, and scenic canals of the "Little Venice" district. The highlight will be our visit to the fascinating <u>Unterlinden Museum</u>, whose pride and joy is the great Isenheim Altarpiece, a world-famous early-16th century painting by Nikolaus of Haguenau and Matthias Grünewald. Afternoon free to explore the town on your own. No group dinner this evening.

Day 7 - Monday, May 15: Excursion into the surrounding Alsatian wine country, situated on the slopes rising from the banks of the nearby Rhine River, which forms the border with Germany to the heights of the Vosges Mountains, behind which stretches the neighbouring French province of Lorraine. We start in the town of Kaysersberg. birthplace of a famous Alsatian,



Dr. Albert Schweitzer, then continue through the vineyards to the medieval jewel of <u>Riquewihr</u>, still surrounded by city walls and arguably one of the prettiest wine villages in the world! During a winery visit and tasting, we will learn about Pinot Gris, Riesling, Gewuerztraminer and other typical Alsatian grape varietas. Return to Colmar and visit to the small museum dedicated to the life and work of a local sculptor, Auguste Bartholdi, whose worldfamous masterpiece is the Statue of Liberty, given by France to the US in 1876, on the occasion of the centennial of the American Declaration of Independence. This evening, our dinner in a typical restaurant will feature Flammekueche, the Alsatian equivalent of pizza!

Day 8 - Tuesday, May 16: Morning visit to fabulous National Automobile the Museum in the nearby city of Mulhouse, where no less than 500 vintage cars are on display, some of which were once owned by celebrities such as Charlie Chaplin, French president Poincaré, and Belgium's King Leopold. Then we tour the heights of the Vosges Mountains, following the 'Routes des Crêtes" to the top (well, almost) of the Grand Ballon, with an altitude of 1,424 m the highest mountain of the entire chain. At the Bonhomme Mountain Pass (Col du Bonhomme, alt. 949m), we will be reminded of the Great

War of 1914-1918, when this was the scene of heavy fighting! Return to Colmar via the scenic Valley of Munster, famous for its pungent cheese! Today, group lunch OR dinner.

<u>Day 9 - Wednesday, May 17</u>: Today we visit the capital of Alsace which also happens to be one the two capitals of the European Union, <u>Strasbourg</u>. Our guided tour will cover all the highlights, including the Cathedral, one of the finest in France, with its amazing spire, the quaint "Petite France" district on the banks of the Ill River, the Palais de l'Europe (EU headquarters), and the <u>Musée d'Alsace</u>, focusing on the traditional arts and crafts of the province. Also some free time for shopping and individual exploration, and return to Colmar in late afternoon. No group dinner this evening, but it will be possible to enjoy an optional gourmet dinner in one of the town's numerous highly-rated restaurants.

<u>Day 10 - Thursday, May 18</u>: Departure from Colmar after breakfast. Crossing the Rhine into Germany, we enter the region of Baden, similar in many ways to nearby Alsace and famous for its wine! Via the vineyards on the slopes of the Kaiserstuhl Mountain, an extinct volcano that inspired ancient legends, we soon reach <u>Freiburg</u>. That vibrant old university city, crisscrossed by small streams coming down from the hills of the Black Forest, a mountain range of forest-covered hills that rise just outside the city. After a walk through the historical city centre, huddled around the Gothic Cathedral, and a lunch break, we enter the Black Forest and head for its most famous resort, <u>Titisee</u>, nestled on the shore of a beautiful lake of the same name. In late afternoon we continue through

the bucolic hills and valleys of the Black Forest to the town of <u>Donaueschingen</u>, where we visit the most famous attraction, the source of the River Danube (<u>Donauquelle</u>), before checking into a traditional superior 3-star hotel, the <u>Grüner Baum</u>. Dinner of Black Forest specialties in the hotel's restaurant.

<u>Day 11 - Friday, May 19</u>: Full-day excursion in the southern Black Forest and just across the Rhine and the Swiss border, with as highlights the <u>Rhine</u>



<u>Falls</u> in the town of Schaffhausen, the most powerful waterfall in Europe, and the picture-perfect medieval town of <u>Stein am Rhein</u>. Dinner again in our hotel in Donaueschingen.

<u>Day 12 - Saturday, May 20</u>: Departure after breakfast. We leave the Black Forest and soon reach <u>Lake Constance</u>, known locally as the Bodensee, one of the largest freshwater lakes in Europe, a vast and beautiful body of water, fed by the Rhine River and separating Germany from both Austria and Switzerland. Following the

scenic northern lakeshore, we pause for lunch in the quaint town of <u>Lindau</u>, located on a small offshore island connected to the mainland by a causeway. In the afternoon we cross into Austria and head for the town of <u>Dornbirn</u>, and check into the first-class/four-star <u>Hotel Krone</u>. Free time to settle in, and dinner in the hotel.

<u>Day 13 – Sunday, May 21</u>: Morning sightseeing in nearby <u>Bregenz</u>, the very attractive capital of Austria's westernmost state (*Land*), <u>Vorarlberg</u>, and situated on the shores of Lake Constance This city is the home of a famous annual music festival, the Bregenz Festspiele, featuring performances on a stage jutting out into the lake! In the afternoon, leisurely exploration of the nearby Bregenz Forest (<u>Bregenzerwald</u>), a scenic landscape promoted to the tentative UNESCO list of World Heritage Sites, characterized by romantic river valleys, gently rolling hills as well as impressive peaks, and many quaint ancient villages such as Schwarzenberg, featuring traditional farms and wooden houses. Return to Dornbirn in late afternoon and rest of the day at leisure to explore the town of relax in the hotel's spa facilities. No group dinner this evening.

Day 14- Wednesday, May 22: Excursion through the Rhine Valley to Chur, allegedly the oldest town of Switzerland and the pretty little capital of the canton of Graubünden, a.k.a. the Grisons; this is a multilingual region, where German dominates but the spoken languages include Italian and of course the regional language, Romansh. After lunch, for which we highly recommend a delicious local specialty, *Bündnerfleisch* or "Grisons meat." In the afternoon we enter the principality of Liechtenstein, a miniature country tucked between Switzerland and Austria, and explore Vaduz, its capital, a village rather than a city! Return to our hotel in late



afternoon. Auf-Wiedersehen dinner in the restaurant of our hotel.

<u>Day 15 - Thursday, May 23</u>: After breakfast, transfer to Zurich Airport (125km) in time for the departure around 1PM of our non-stop return flight to Toronto with Air Canada, arriving around 4PM.

Included in the tour price are:

- Return flight Toronto-Zurich with Air Canada, including one checked suitcase;

I know that tour programs include walking, and may including hiking and fitness programs that have potential hazardous activities associated with them. I should not participate prior to approval by my physician. I assume any and all other risks associated with these events included but not limited to falls, contact with other participants, the effects of the weather including high heat and/or humidity. 3. To release, indemnify and hold harmless Pauwels Travel Bureau and their affiliates (which term shall include parents, subsidiaries, officers, directors, shareholders, agents and employees of Pauwels Travel Bureau as well as Pauwels Travel themselves) (the "Released Parties") from, and agree not to sue the Released Parties for, any claims that I may have arising from, or in connection with, any personal injury, bodily injury, mental anguish, emotional distress, physical, property or other damage that I may suffer from any cause whatsoever related in any way to my participation in this tour. This release also includes activities not offered that may be considered risky. I further release any Tour Directors, bus drivers or other individuals involved in my tour. 4. That the air carrier's liability for loss of or damage to baggage or property, or for death or injury to person, is limited by their tariffs, or the Warsaw Convention, or both. 5. That Pauwels Travel Bureau shall have no liability or responsibility for

me when I am absent from activities, such as visits to friends or relatives or during stay-ahead/stay-behind option periods if the stay-ahead/stay-behind period does not include the services of a Tour Director. 6. To abide by directions of my Tour Director or other leadership personnel during my tour. Failure to do so may result in my termination from tour immediately. I understand that to disobey such rules or directions are to waive the right to any refund, and that I may be sent home at my own expense. The participant and family undertake full financial responsibility for any damage caused by the participant and agree to pay his/her return home on the first available flight, should his/her behavior be deemed detrimental to the welfare of the group. 7. To abide by all local laws when in Canada and abroad, including those concerning drugs and alcohol. That if I become ill or incapacitated, Pauwels Travel and its employees, or a designated chaperone may take any action they deem necessary for my safety and well-being, including securing medical treatment (at my own expense) and transporting me home.
